Lower School Behavioral Expectations

While in school, students are expected to follow the Three R's of Learning: We are **Respectful**, We are **Responsible**, We are **Ready to Learn**. In keeping with that theme, there are also expectations to follow when learning in a virtual environment. Adhering to these guidelines will help to ensure a successful learning experience during the online instructional time. Please monitor your child while he/she is in class and support your child with the following expectations.

We are Respectful

1. Students should speak with respect to teachers and classmates.
2. Support your child in remaining focused and engaged. A fidget may be helpful so long as it is not a toy.
3. Students **MAY NOT** meet for class from their bed.
4. The "classroom" work area should be at a desk or table, free of distractions. That means there should be no other people in the background except a parent who is supporting his/her child. The television should be off.
5. Students are not permitted to eat during class. A water bottle is permitted.
6. Students should dress appropriately (no pajamas, no hoodies) and practice good hygiene, including combing or brushing hair.

We are Responsible

1. Students are required to attend every online class.
2. Students should sign into class five minutes early so the teacher is not waiting.
3. All work is to be completed before class begins.
4. Make sure that your child has had breakfast before morning classes and has had lunch before afternoon classes.

We are Ready to Learn

1. All materials should be ready for each class including homework, classwork papers, and writing utensils.
2. It is encouraged that the video is on so that the teacher can see your child. This helps to enhance the learning experience.
3. Students may sit and stand during instructional time for focus and attention as long as it is not distracting others.
